## North Lopham Parish Council

Robert Carley was in the Chair. The last minutes were corrected to show that NCC will adopt the footpaths to the west of the street this year. Grit bins have been placed by the school and in Kings Head Lane. **Planning;** an application has been received for a 5<sup>th</sup> house on the Meadow Farm development. **Highways and footpaths;** damage to various road signs has been reported to highways. A deep pothole opposite Linen Lane (the new development near the war memorial) will be reported. The blocked drain in Church Road is to be cleared. Church Road/The Street/The Green and Harling Road are scheduled for resurfacing this year. A dangerously rotten tree near the school will be reported to the relevant landowner. **Community Matters;** Village car scheme; details of the new Kenninghall voluntary scheme were submitted for consideration. Councillor Tate proposed that a bench be placed by the war memorial, at her expense, to commemorate the Queen's Jubilee, if the PC agrees to maintain it. Agreed; to liaise with Mr. Bush who currently looks after that area. Councillor McManus reported that a local family who lost their tied house when the father lost his job were 'not qualified' to be re-housed locally. The Council sympathised but have no say in Housing Policy. **Next meeting; 14<sup>th</sup> March;** reports on Jubilee Bench, Car Scheme.

2012. **1)** The appointment of Stephen Reynolds as the new Parish Clerk was approved. He has accepted the post on a temporary basis pending a more permanent appointment. **2)** The issue of footpaths and public rights of way was discussed. In particular, it was decided that Council members would undertake a walk of Rolfe's Track on Saturday, 10<sup>th</sup> March 2012, meeting at the Visitors' Centre for Redgrave and Lopham Fen. Any resident of South Lopham is welcome to join the walk. **3)** Efforts are still being made to persuade Norfolk CC to move back the 30 m.p.h. sign on the A1066 entering the village from Diss. A further meeting has been arranged, the outcome of which will be reported after the next PC meeting. **4)** The telephone kiosk in Primrose Lane is now being used for a book exchange. Residents of South and North Lopham are encouraged to both lend and borrow books. **5)** The Parish Council website is well worth a visit as its scope has been expanded under the management of Steve Reynolds. Comments and contributions are welcome. **6)** It was reported that preparations for the Jubilee celebrations to take place at the Village Hall on 2<sup>nd</sup> June 2012 are continuing (see separate entry). **7)** The new Church notice board (complete with a plaque on the back) is now finished. This has used up nearly all the £1,000 legacy from Beatrice Malson. Approximately £150 remains to be spent.
