Meeting 9<sup>th</sup> January; apologies received from Councillor Bird; two members of the public attended.

**Lophams' Links**, which tried to raise funds for a play area has disbanded through lack of support. They will repay £200 donated by NLPC. **Affordable Housing and Play area;** Discussions involving the Duke of Norfolk, his Trustees and the tenant about a scheme whereby a mixture of affordable housing, private housing and possibly a play area may be built on land adjacent to Primrose Lane are in their early stages. **20 mph speed limit;** a site visit by Norfolk Highways, the police, Councillors and interested members of the public will take place on 15<sup>th</sup> January at 10 am. Meeting at 'The Mess'. (Note this meeting was postponed because of the snow). **Speed awareness** stickers have been delivered and will be distributed for display. **More potholes** have been reported to Highways. **Complaints** about overgrown hedges and wide vehicles damaging verges have been received. **Dog fouling** in Primrose Lane appears to be reduced - good news. The revised **precept** is yet to be confirmed. **Village Charities Officers elections;** M Cox and J Vere were re-elected. R Cook wished to step down and was replaced by D Eagle. The Clerk, on behalf of NLPC, expressed appreciation of the role Robert McCaw, retiring Chairman of SLPC, has played in enhancing cooperation between the two PCs. ## St Nicholas' Church

The Christmas season is almost over! We are very grateful to all those who took part in any of the special services, and to those who decorated the church so beautifully so that everything was in place for Christmas Day.

The following points of interest arose from the Meeting held on the evening of Thursday, 10<sup>th</sup> January:- **1)** Robert McCaw retired as Chairman and as a Councillor because he and his wife Madeleine are leaving the district in early February. **Nominations are invited for the position of Councillor.** Anyone interested should contact the Clerk, Caroline Phillips, on clerk@southlopham.co.uk - telephone number 01379 687950. For the moment the office of Chairman will rotate among the Councillors. **2)** The Council has now purchased a supply of **Slow Down In Our Village** posters for attaching to wheelie bins. Anyone who would like to participate in this scheme should contact the Clerk as above. **3)** The Precept for the year 2013/14 has been confirmed at £3,000. Owing to revised arrangements regarding welfare relief £237 of this amount will be paid by central Government, through Breckland Council. **4)** The Council noted that in various areas around the village there is **water on the roads** caused by over-flowing ditches and blocked drains. We are endeavouring to deal with this situation through the Highways Authority. If anyone becomes aware of such an issue could they please contact the Clerk, as above. Recent experience indicates that such water flows are not generally caused by a burst main, so please check the situation before calling Anglia Water. **5)** Could all **dog walkers** please remember to equip themselves with doggie-doodie bags to avoid the fouling of the village footpaths.
